Session: #15 "Regional dimension for GEO and capacity building priorities"

In recent years, EO (space/in-situ/airborne/ground) data providers around the world have made significant progress in pooling capacities. However, despite the emergence of a number of programmes and initiatives - notably GEO and Copernicus - operating on different scales (i.e. national, regional and global) the EO landscape is still considerably fragmented. Companies (notably SMEs) and institutions which could use the data to produce new geo-information services are often either unaware of data sources, unable to exploit them, or both. This makes it difficult for potential end-users to benefit from the data, via operational, user-friendly and sustained user-relevant geo-information services relying on it.

Drawing on previous consultations and projects, this session will address issues related to:

- Tools and methodologies for the effective and sustainable exploitation of complementary EO resources and expertise;
- Ways to overcome the challenge of engaging service and user communities in the region (public authorities, research institutions, and private sector)
