

- initiated in 2007
- consultation process 2011-2013
- implementation under the Pan-African Facility PanAf (EU-AU) in 2016
- Phase 1: Services for Landmonitoring, Water Resources, Marine & Coastal
- coordination by AUC









Achievements

- International dimension of Copernicus -> concept for GMES&Africa
- Copernicus data (incl. Sentinels) & information -> free, open and full access
- African Space Policy & strategy adopted by African Heads of State on Jan 31 2016
- Service development with the involvement of private sector companies & universities
- Inventory of African Private Sector companies in EO & Geospatial Analysis (AARSE/EARSC, funded by EC) 2016 (shortly to be published):

A total of **78** companies replied representing **21** African countries.














Regional dimension for GEO and capacity building priorities
















Regional dimension for GEO and capacity building priorities



Companies' expectations from collaboration with AARSE & EARSC














Challenges & Lessons Learned

Recommendations/ Way forward
